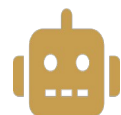

” *In real classrooms, we watched it happen: students who could quote Scripture and answer every question correctly — yet who, in honest moments, still weren't sure who they were, what they believed, or what God wanted for their lives. The transformation God's Word promises wasn't becoming evident in how they lived. The issue wasn't the students, and it wasn't their teachers. It was the model: education has become very good at helping students pass a test, and not nearly as good at forming who they become.*

This is the founding conviction behind FaithCore Lab™ — education should do more than transmit information. It should form who a student becomes.

Why I created FaithCore Lab

When I joined the U.S. Navy Reserve, I was introduced to online education — completing my own college degree remotely, back when that was brand new. It made me a lifelong proponent of what well-built online learning can do, and I spent decades designing it for corporations and universities before turning that craft toward Christian education.

Later, teaching high school Bible and history, I found students who could pass every test and still hadn't wrestled with the ideas behind the facts. The issue wasn't the students, or their teachers. It was the model.

FaithCore Lab was born from a simple conviction: education should do more than prepare students for college or a career. It should prepare them for life — to know God's Word, build their identity on who God says they are, and faithfully live out the purpose for which He created them.

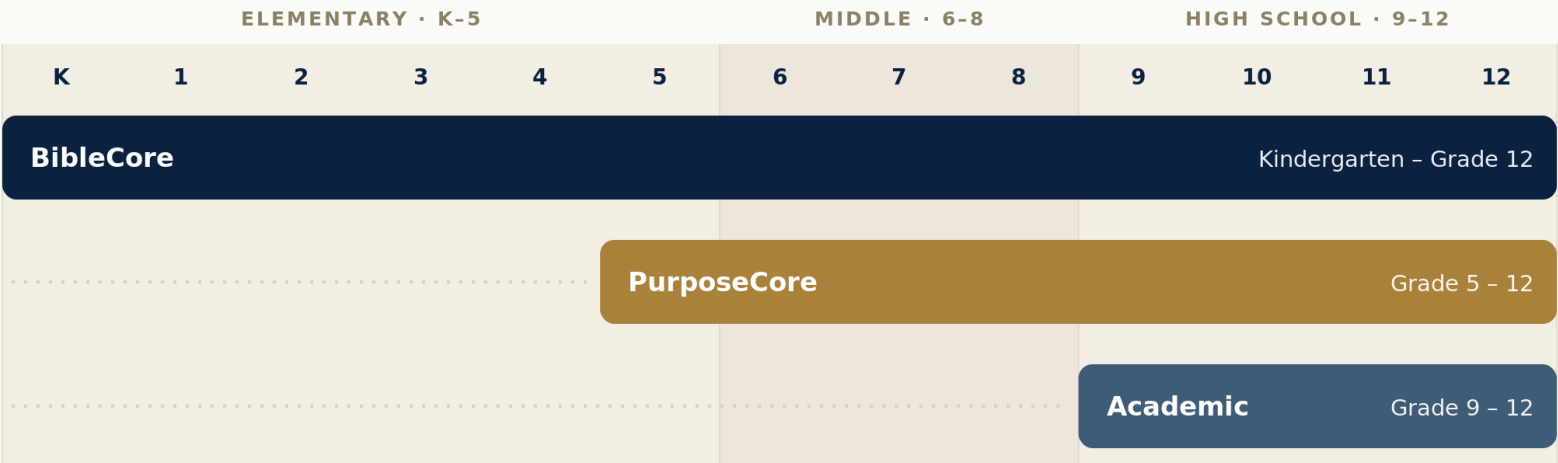

The FaithCore Lab Curriculum

One connected Core, Kindergarten through Grade 12 — three lines that build on each other.



How the three lines fit together

- BibleCore runs every year, Kindergarten through Grade 12 — the spine the whole curriculum is built on.
- PurposeCore begins in Grade 5 and continues through Grade 12 — Christian formation, year by year.
- Academic courses run Grades 9-12 — history, government, economics, and the humanities, each taught through a biblical lens, with both full-year core courses and semester electives.

Every student walks the whole story of Scripture, once a year, every year.

Elementary & Middle • K-8

The life of Jesus and the great stories of Scripture, followed closely — building a child's earliest sense of who God is and who they are in His story.

High School • Bible I-IV

Biblical worldview, doctrine, and Christian ethics — the hardest questions of the faith, met head-on and taught entirely from Scripture.

Full transcript titles, credit values, and grade bands — every course drops cleanly into a standard Christian-school transcript and grade records.

The Bible class reaches the dinner table.

Every BibleCore lesson, K-12, ends at home. Each one closes with a “This Week at Home — for families” take-home and a “Prayer for This Week” — so what a student learns in class becomes a conversation around the family table that night. The formation continues past the classroom, in every lesson, at every grade.

For example, Grade 3, Lesson 1 sends home: “The story: God spoke to Moses from the burning bush and promised, ‘I will be with you.’ ... Ask your child to teach you this week’s memory verse.” And the prayer: “Dear God, thank You that You are holy and always with me. Help me listen to You. Amen.”

We test the teaching. Never the testimony.

A student's beliefs, testimony, and heart are never graded — those are between the student and God. What we hold to a real standard is understanding, evidence, and reasoning.

BibleCore gives students the truth. But Scripture itself calls us not only to know the Word — to become like the One it reveals. A student can know every fact and still enter adulthood unsure who they are, what they believe, and why they matter. In the absence of a strong identity, culture is always ready to provide one.

That gap — between knowing and becoming — is exactly what PurposeCore exists to close.

God creates each of us with a unique purpose. We help students discover what that is — and build the skills to live it out. PurposeCore begins in Grade 5 as a bridge into middle school, then continues through Grade 12.

washing feet, not seizing thrones — the model for influence and leadership.



He reasoned rather than coerced

listening first to truly understand, then answering with questions that led others to their own insight — the model for discernment.



He is the truest neighbor

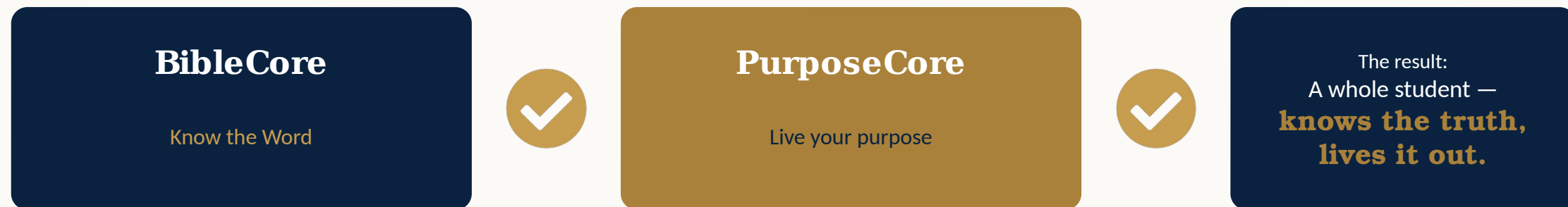
crossing the greatest distance for the hurting — the model for character.

Vocabulary

Term	Definition
Worldview	The set of basic beliefs about reality — God, the world, humanity, right and wrong — through which a person interprets everything else. The lens, not the thing seen.
Presupposition	A belief assumed before the argument begins. Everyone reasons from presuppositions; the question is whether yours are true.
Metanarrative	The big overarching story that gives meaning to all the smaller stories. The Bible's metanarrative is Creation → Fall → Redemption → Restoration.
Revelation	God making Himself known. He reveals through creation (general revelation) and supremely through Scripture and Christ (special revelation).
Naturalism	The worldview that the physical universe is all that exists — no God, no soul, no purpose beyond what we invent. A common modern lens.
Imago Dei	The image of God (Genesis 1:27). A core lens of the biblical worldview: every person has dignity and meaning because they bear God's image.
